MOORE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF AGING

MOORE COUNTY YOUTH SERVICES

Moore County Youth Services provides a program called the Adventure Based Challenge Program. This program is valuable for any youth, especially those with drug and alcohol problems. The individual gets to look at their true reactions and feelings. They learn risk-taking, trust, communication and listening skills, how to support each other, and how to relate in a group.

MOORE COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

A narcotics officer is on duty to take phone calls and provide information and referral information. A special officer is available for speaking to area school groups to provide drug information. A drug van is also available for use with area groups and agencies. Drop box for old or unused medications available 24/7.

A Family Planning Clinic is available to county citizens that provides pre-conceptual counseling which includes drug use issues that affect pregnancy. A Pre-Natal Clinic maintains informational programs for women throughout their pregnancy regarding alcohol/drug effects with treatment referral as necessary.

SOUTHERN PINES POLICE DEPARTMENT

TOBACCO REALITY UNFILTERED (TRU)

FirstHealth Community Health Services, in cooperation with Moore County Schools, have worked to implement a successful youth tobacco use prevention program throughout Moore County. Training is provided to the staff and students in youth tobacco use prevention strategies and activities. Tobacco Reality Unfiltered (TRU), a media campaign, work to reduce teen tobacco use by educating peers and presenting to younger students about the dangers of tobacco.

DAYMARK RECOVERY SERVICES

Evaluation of individuals and families having substance abuse problems can be accomplished with appropriate intervention programs designed. Referral to detoxification and residential programs can be made as needed. Access to all residential programs listed in this brochure can be made through Daymark. Group counseling is the primary treatment process with family groups available. Community support groups such as Al-Anon, AA, and NA are utilized as referral groups. RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES

BETHESDA, INC.

A residential rehabilitation facility for males with substance abuse problems. Also available is non-medical detoxification with coordinated referral to appropriate treatment programs. Residents attend AA/NA on a daily basis and individual and group counseling is available.

BETHANY HOUSE

A residential program for female substance abusers. The program includes AA/NA attendance, group counseling, and assistance in obtaining employment. Special emphasis is placed on recovery issues particular to women.

PORT HUMAN SERVICES

An intensive residential program for adolescents ages 13-17. The program offers a comprehensive plan of treatment, education, and residential placement. Residents are taught socialization skills, life and living skills, as well as recovery issues. Supervision on a daily basis is designed to make the transition back into the family setting with little disruption. A family program for parents and siblings is also offered during residence. AA/NA attendance is required and male and female adolescents are accepted.

SAMARITAN COLONY

A 28 day residential program for adult males. The program emphasizes AA and educational components of recovery of a supportive nature designed to assist the substance abuser when he returns to the community. A family program is available.

Sandhills Teen Challenge is a residential faith based recovery program for men ages 18+ with a drug or alcohol problem. STC is located on a large campus site in Carthage with three dormitories for up to 38 men.

DAYMARK RECOVERY SERVICES

Following discharge from a residential facility and/or hospital, support is maintained through regular group counseling sessions. Family members are encouraged to participate in the recovery process with the substance abuser.
